

Government Price Controls Are Disastrous

Government-mandated interest rate price controls harm, not help, Texas consumers



Government-mandated price controls on gasoline during the late 1970s exacerbated a massive gas shortage causing consumers to wait hours in lines - costing them much more in time and money.

Government-mandated rent pricing controls have been a disaster for US cities. In a 2012 survey of leading economists, a mere 2% thought that price controls on rent improved the availability and quality of affordable housing.
